### VOTE “NO” on reauthorizing Section 702 of FISA

**Action:** Write to your U.S. Representative and urge them to let Section 702 of the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act expire.

**Background:**

The U.S. Supreme Court has refused to hear *Wikimedia v. NSA*, the ACLU lawsuit challenging the NSA's mass surveillance of Americans' online communications with family, friends, and others abroad. Instead of reauthorizing Section 702 of the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act (FISA), the law used to justify this unconstitutional spying, Congress must let it expire.
